RAP #1

NARRATOR

REFLECTIONS

Matthew 18:21-35

The Parable of the Unmerciful Servant

- Have you ever been stressed because you knew you owed something to someone? Maybe an apology? An explanation? An admission of something you had done? Money?
- Think of a time you gathered your courage to go to that person(s) to ask for forgiveness.
- How did it turn out? Worse than expected, or better?
- How did you feel after seeking forgiveness? Were you relieved, or sorry you brought it up?
- Can you think of a time you felt you were “owed” something by someone else? Money? An apology? An explanation?
- If that person came to you to ask forgiveness, how did you respond?
- Is it easier to remember everything you think you are owed than to remember all the times we’ve been forgiven?
- When it comes to forgiveness, what does it mean to, “Do unto others as you would have them do unto you?”
- Is it tough to comprehend that God has forgiven you of all your sins? Do you deserve this? How does this make you feel when others do you wrong?
- Is there anything you feel you should ask for forgiveness now?
- Is there anyone you might choose to forgive now, whether or not they come to you?
