<u>VERSE 4</u> NARRATOR

NARRATOR I bet you remember the end.

<u>ALL</u>

REFLECTIONS

Read Luke 10:25-37

- On first instinct, who are you in this story? The victim, the one who helps, or the "church person."
- Why do you identify with that person?
- Think of a time you have been the person in need. Did someone help you? Whether they did or not, how did it feel?
- Have you ever received help from an unexpected person? Maybe someone you don't know? Or maybe you don't especially like each other?
- Which person in the story would you LIKE to be? Why?
- What do you think is stopping you from becoming the person you would LIKE to be? Fear of what people will think? Other fears? Too busy? Don't think about it enough? Don't really care enough to do anything?
- Can you think of ways to move toward becoming the person you WANT to be?
- Can you think of someone in your life right now with a need that you could help meet?
- Will you commit to helping that person this week? Will you commit to helping them or someone else every week?
